The students presented a special assembly based on the theme 'Humility' with great passion and zeal.

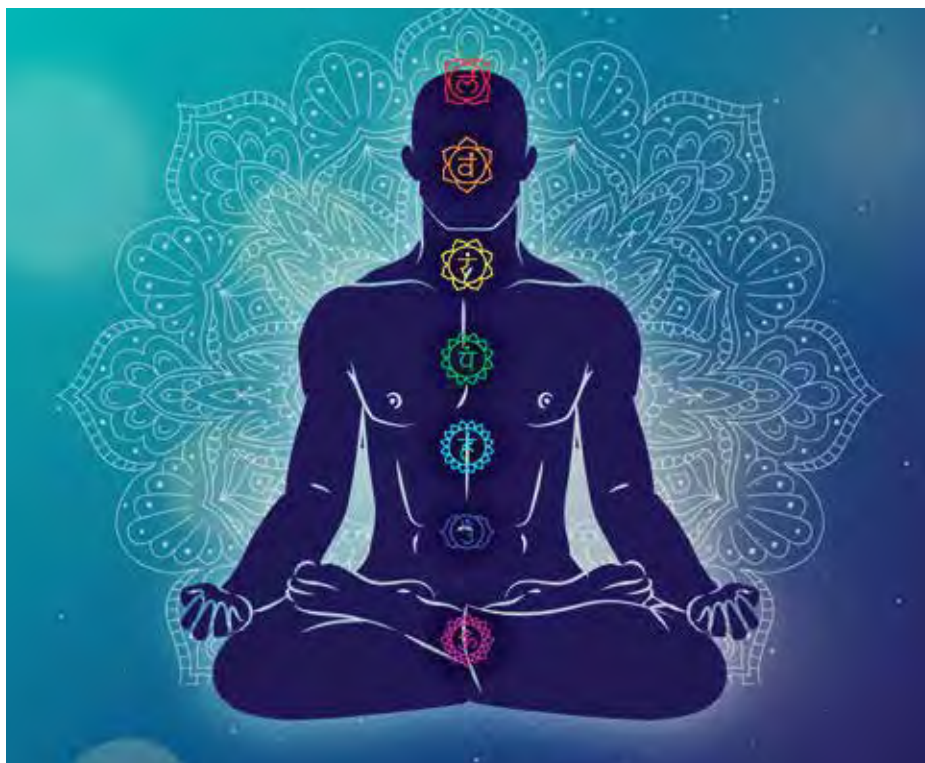
